either the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairmanship or the Interior Ministry portfolio. The storm erupted after Naqvi walked away with the Asia Cup 2025 trophy presentation, overshadowing the Indian team's triumph and sparking global criticism. Now, with Pakistan licking wounds after three humiliating defeats to India in the same tournament, pressure has doubled on Naqvi's leadership.

"PCB is totally different from the Interior Ministry. They must be kept separate," Afridi's advice.

"Naqvi cannot rely totally on advisers. These advisers are taking him nowhere," Afridi on leadership flaws.

Afridi, never one to mince words, also hinted that even Pakistan's Army Chief has been informally nudged to advise Naqvi on the matter. The legendary all-rounder insists that "Pakistan cricket needs special attention and time," and until the PCB has a full-time leader, the nation will continue to stumble.

Kirmani laments politics overshadowing cricket

Former Indian wicketkeeper Syed Kirmani has voiced his disappointment over the recent Asia Cup 2025 trophy controversy, where the Indian team refused to accept the trophy from ACC chairman and Pakistan Cricket Board chief

Mohsin Naqvi after defeating arch-rivals Pakistan by five wickets in a thrilling final.

Kirmani said, "The way cricket is being played all around... there has been no gentleman-news in the game. There have been very rude, arrogant gestures on the field. It is very depressing to

me the way things are going in the sporting field, particularly in cricket... Politics should not enter sports in general. Leave politics behind."

During the post-match ceremony, Indian players collected individual awards - Kuldeep Yadav, Abhishek Sharma, and Tilak Varma from other dignitaries, while Salman Khan accepted the runners-up cheque from Naqvi. The ACC chairman did not acknowledge the Indian players, confirming the tensions on the stage. ICCI secretary Devajit Saikia later clarified that India's refusal was a principled stand, emphasising that

the trophy and medals should be returned to India.

Kirmani also commented on India T20I skipper Suryakumar Yadav's donation of match fees to the Indian army, saying, "Any noble cause is understandable, but do not relate it to politics. In our time, cricketers had such wonderful camaraderie... Pakistani players coming to India, going to Pakistan. What hostility, what love, what affection... I have to put my head down as a cricketer."

For Kirmani, the episode is a sobering reminder that cricket's "Gentleman's Game" is being overshadowed by politics, leaving fans and former players alike yearning for the spirit of the sport to prevail.

Pakistan is no competition: Tilak

Indian batter Tilak Varma agreed with captain Suryakumar Yadav's statement that Pakistan is no competition for India.

Varma shared his experience of facing pressure during the Asia Cup final against Pakistan, stating, a lot was going on in my mind, but the country is above everything else.

"I agree with what Surya bhai (Surya Kumar Yadav) said, that it (Pakistan) is no competition. But we change our strategy from match to match. There indeed was pressure; a lot was going on in my mind, but the country is above everything else. India is at the top. So, I was determined to give everything for my country. I tried to be calm," Tilak Varma told the media.

During the run-chase, India sank to 203 due to an initial burst from Faheem Ashraf (3/20). However, Tilak Varma (69* in 53 balls, with three fours and four sixes) attacked a 39-run stand with Sanja Sanvoo (34 in 21 balls, with two fours and a six) to bring India back into the game.

Shivam Dube (33 in 22 balls, with two fours and two sixes) delivered some carnage with Tilak, solidifying India's hold on the game despite some occasional brilliance from Pakistan. In the end, it was Rinku Singh, who was featuring in his first Asia Cup match, who got the chance to hit the winning runs on the first ball.
