1. To receive, consider and adopt the Audited Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2025, the Statement of Profit & Loss and Cash Flow Statement for the year ended on that date and the Reports of the Directors and Statutory Auditor thereon.
2. To appoint a Director in place of Mr. Sajjan Kumar Sharma (DIN: 02162166), who retires by rotation in terms of Section 152(6) of the Companies Act, 2013 and being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment.

SPECIAL BUSINESS:

3. **To appoint M/s B.K.Barik & Associates (FCS: 5696, C.P.No: 3897), Practicing Company Secretary, Kolkata, as the Secretarial Auditor of the Company and to fix their remuneration:**

To consider and if thought fit, to pass with or without modification(s), the following resolution as an Ordinary Resolution:

1. **THE MINISTRY OF CORPORATE AFFAIRS ("MCA") HAS VIDE ITS GENERAL CIRCULAR NO. 20/2020 DATED MAY 05, 2020 AND GENERAL CIRCULAR NO. 09/2024 DATED SEPTEMBER 19, 2024 (COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO AS "MCA CIRCULARS") PERMITTED THE HOLDING OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING ("THE MEETING" OR "AGM") THROUGH VIDEO CONFERENCING ("VC") OR OTHER AUDIO VISUAL MEANS ("OAVM"), WITHOUT THE PHYSICAL PRESENCE OF THE MEMBERS AT A COMMON VENUE TILL SEPTEMBER 30, 2025, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH 3 AND 4 OF THE MCA GENERAL CIRCULAR NO. 20/2020 DATED MAY 05, 2020. THE SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE BOARD OF INDIA ("SEBI") VIDE ITS CIRCULAR NO. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD1/CIR/P/2020/79 DATED MAY 12, 2020 AND CIRCULAR NO. SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-PoD-2/P/CIR/2024/133 DATED OCTOBER 03, 2024 (COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO AS "SEBI CIRCULARS") PROVIDED CERTAIN RELAXATIONS FROM COMPLIANCE WITH CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE SEBI (LISTING OBLIGATIONS AND DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS) REGULATIONS, 2015 ("SEBI LISTING REGULATIONS"). 2. **PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, A MEMBER ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE AT THE AGM IS ENTITLED TO APPOINT A PROXY TO ATTEND AND VOTE ON A POLL INSTEAD OF HIMSELF/HERSELF AND THE PROXY NEED NOT TO BE A MEMBER OF THE COMPANY.**
HOWEVER, SINCE THE AGM IS BEING HELD THROUGH VC/OAVM, PURSUANT TO THE MCA CIRCULARS AND SEBI CIRCULARS, PHYSICAL ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS HAS BEEN DISPENSED WITH. ACCORDINGLY, THE FACILITY FOR APPOINTMENT OF PROXY/(IES) UNDER SECTION 105 OF THE ACT BY THE MEMBERS TO ATTEND AND CAST VOTE FOR THE MEMBERS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR THIS AGM AND HENCE THE PROXY FORM AND ATTENDANCE SLIP ARE NOT ANNEXED TO THIS NOTICE.
3. Institutional/Corporate Members (i.e. other than Individuals/HUF/NRI etc.) intending to authorize its representatives to attend the meeting through VC/OAVM and/or to vote thereat through e-Voting/ Remote e-Voting, on its behalf, are required to send a certified copy of the Board/its Governing Body's Resolution/Authorization (scanned copy in .pdf/.jpg format only), pursuant to Section 113 of the Act, or upload it on the e-Voting portal. The said Resolution/Authorisation may be sent by E-mail through the registered email address to the Scrutinizer, Mr. Ashok Kumar Daga at daga.ashok@gmail.com or to the Company's email ids at kolkata@kkalpanaplastick.co.in/ companysecretary@kkalpanaplastick.co.in.
4. The attendance of the Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM will be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Act.
5. In compliance with the provisions of Section 108 of the Act, read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of the SEBI Listing Regulations (as amended) and the MCA Circulars in relation to e-Voting Facility provided by listed entities, the Company is pleased to provide the facility of remote e-voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has availed the services of National Securities Depository Limited ("NSDL") to conduct its AGM through VC/OAVM mode and for electronic voting (e-Voting) (both Remote e-Voting and e-Voting at the meeting).
6. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 30 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notes of the Notice of 36th AGM. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available to 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding

2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee, Stakeholders Relationship Committee and Auditors etc., who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis. The members will be able to view the proceedings on the NSDL's e-Voting website at www.evoting.nsdl.com. The link for viewing one-way live webcast of the AGM will be made available on the company's website at www.kkalpanaplastick.com.

7. The Statement, pursuant to Section 102 of the Act setting out material facts concerning the Special Business under Item No: 3 of the Notice of 36th AGM is annexed hereto. In terms of Regulation 17(11) of the SEBI Listing Regulations, the Board of Directors of the Company ("the Board"), at its meeting held on May 20, 2025, recommended for considering the Special Business under Item No: 3, being considered unavoidable, at the 36th AGM of the Company.

The relevant details, pursuant to Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI Listing Regulations and Clause 1.2.5 read with any other applicable clause of Secretarial Standards on General Meetings ("SS-2") issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India ("ICSI"), as revised and applicable, in respect of Director seeking appointment/re-appointment at this AGM, is also annexed. Requisite declaration has been received from Director seeking appointment/re-appointment.

8. Register of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel of the Company and their respective shareholding maintained under Section 170 of the Act and the Register of Contracts and Arrangements, in which the Directors are interested, maintained under Section 189 of the Act, will be available for inspection, in electronic mode, by the members at the AGM.
9. All documents referred to in the Notice convening the 36th AGM and related Statement pursuant to Section 102 of the Act and Notes containing the details for e-Voting (Collectively referred to as "Notice" or "Notice of AGM") will also be available for inspection, only in electronic mode, by the members from the date of circulation of the Notice upto the date of AGM i.e. September 25, 2025. Members seeking to inspect such documents can send an e-mail to the Company Secretary, Mr. Navdeep Bhansali at companysecretary@kkalpanaplastick.co.in.
10. In compliance with the provisions of Section 108 of the Act read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Amendment Rules, 2015, Regulation 44 of the SEBI Listing Regulations, as amended, MCA Circulars, SEBI Circulars and SS-2 issued by the ICSI, the Company is pleased to provide to its members, facility to exercise their right to vote on all resolutions set forth in the Notice convening the 36th AGM, electronically, through electronic voting (e-Voting) services (both Remote e-Voting and e-Voting at AGM) facilitated by NSDL. All items of the business specified in the Notice may be transacted through remote e-Voting (facility to cast vote from a place other than the venue of the AGM)/e-Voting (facility to cast vote electronically at AGM) services provided by NSDL. Instructions and other information relating to remote e-Voting/e-Voting are given in the notice under note no.22. It may be noted that the facility for e-Voting at AGM shall be available for members who do not cast their vote through Remote e-Voting. Members who have cast their vote through Remote e-Voting may attend the AGM through VC/OAVM but shall not be entitled to cast their votes at the Meeting once again.

The Company has not arranged for physical voting through ballot papers, pursuant to MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars, since the meeting is being held through VC/OAVM.

11. Voting rights will be reckoned on the paid-up value of shares registered in the name of the Members as on Thursday, September 18, 2025 (cut-off date). Only those Members whose names are recorded in the Register of Members of the Company or in the Register of Beneficial Owners maintained by the Depositories as on the cut-off date will be entitled to cast their votes by remote e-Voting/e-Voting during the AGM.
12. In case of joint holders, only such joint holder, who is higher in order of names, will be entitled to vote at the meeting.

13. In accordance with the provisions of Section 91 of the Act, the Register of Members and the Share Transfer Books of the Company will remain closed from Friday, September 19, 2025 to Thursday, September 25, 2025 (both days inclusive).
14. Pursuant to Section 101 and Section 136 of the Act read with Rule 18 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 and Rule 11 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and any other applicable provisions of the Act read with relevant rules made thereunder, companies can serve Notice and Annual Report and other communication through electronic mode to those members who have registered their e-mail addresses either with the Company or with Depository Participant(s). Members who have not registered their e-mail addresses may now register the same. Members holding shares in demat form are requested to register their e-mail address with their Depository Participant(s) only.
15. In compliance with Section 101 and Section 136 of the Act read with Rule 18 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 and Rule 11 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and any other applicable provisions of the Act read with relevant rules made thereunder, MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars, Notice of AGM including details and instructions for remote e-Voting/e-Voting and the Annual Report for the Financial Year 2024-2025 of the Company consisting of Financial Statements including Auditors' Report, Boards' Report and related Annexures attached therewith for the Financial Year 2024-2025 (collectively referred to as "Annual Report 2024-2025" or "Annual Report") are being sent only through Electronic mode to those members whose e-mail addresses are registered with the Registrar and Share Transfer Agents ("RTA")/Company/Depository Participants ("DP") and no physical copy of said documents are being sent to any member unless any member has requested for the same, in writing, in advance. Members may note that they have the option to request for hard copy of Annual Report, however, to support the Green Initiative we request the members to consider receiving the same electronically. In case any member is desirous of obtaining hard copy of the Annual Report 2024-2025 of the Company, he/she/it may send request to the Company's email address at kolkata@kkalpanaplastick.co.in/ companysecretary@kkalpanaplastick.co.in mentioning their DP ID and Client ID (in case of demat holdings) or Folio No (in case of physical holdings). Notice and the Annual Report are also uploaded on the Company's website at www.kkalpanaplastick.com and may be accessed by the members. The said documents will also be available on the website of the Stock Exchanges where the shares of the Company are listed i.e. BSE Limited and The Calcutta Stock Exchange Limited at www.bseindia.com and www.cse-india.com respectively and also on the website of NSDL at www.evoting.nsdl.com.
16. To eliminate all risks associated with physical shares and inherent benefits of dematerialization, Members are requested to dematerialise the shares held by them in physical form and notify the change in their name/address/nominations/email-address/contract/Power of Attorney, etc to C B Management Services Private Limited, at Rasoi Court, 5th Floor, 20, Sir R N Mukherjee Road, Kolkata- 700001, the RTA of the Company. Members holding Shares in de-mat form, are requested to intimate any change in their address and/or bank account details to their Depository Participant(s). The Company cannot act on any request received directly from members holding shares in de-mat form for any change in their particulars. Members are requested to support the green initiative efforts of the Company.
17. Members are requested to address all correspondences to the RTA, as mentioned above.
18. In terms of Regulation 40(1) of the SEBI Listing Regulations, as amended, securities of listed companies shall be transferred only in dematerialized form. Members may please note that SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD_RTAMB/P/CIR/2022/8 dated January 25, 2022, has mandated the listed companies to issue securities in dematerialized form only while processing service requests viz. Issue of duplicate share certificate, claim from unclaimed suspense account/escrow account, renewal/exchange of share certificate, endorsement, sub-division/splitting/consolidation of securities certificates/folios, transmission and transposition. SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/PoD-1/OW/P/2022/64923 dated December 30, 2022 provided guidelines with respect to procedural aspects of Suspense Escrow

Demat Account and vide notification dated January 24, 2022, mandated that all requests for transmission and transposition shall be processed only in dematerialised form. In view of the same and to eliminate all risks associated with physical shares and avail various benefits of dematerialisation, Members are advised to dematerialise the shares held by them in physical form.

SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD-PoD-1/P/CIR/2023/37 dated March 16, 2023, effective from April 01, 2023, had prescribed the common and specified norms for processing investor's service request by RTAs and norms for furnishing Permanent Account Number ("PAN"), KYC details and Nomination. Attention of the members of the Company is drawn to the said Circular.

Further, SEBI vide Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD_RTAMB/P/CIR/2022/65 dated May 18, 2022 has simplified the procedure and standardized the format of documents for transmission of securities and vide Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD_RTAMB/P/CIR/2022/70 dated May 25, 2022 prescribed procedure and standardized format of documents for issuance of duplicate securities certificates. Accordingly, members are requested to make service requests by submitting duly filled and signed forms as specified in captioned circulars. It is requested that the members furnish their respective PAN, KYC details and Nomination with the RTA/Company in accordance with said Circulars for updating their related records maintained in the Company. Any service requests or complaints received from the member are being processed by RTA on receipt of aforesaid details/ documents. Members are requested to make service requests by submitting duly filled and signed forms.

19. As per the provisions of Section 72 of the Act, facility for making nomination is available for the Members in respect of the shares held by them. SEBI has mandated furnishing of PAN, KYC details (i.e. Postal Address with PIN Code, email address, mobile number, bank account details) and choice of nomination details by holders of securities in prescribed forms. SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/PoD-1/P/CIR/2023/193 dated December 27, 2023 read with SEBI Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD_RTAMB/P/CIR/2022/23 dated February 24, 2022 and SEBI Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/RTAMB/CIR/P/2021/601 dated July 23, 2021 extended timeline for demat account holders for providing choice of nomination details upto June 30, 2024. On or after July 01, 2024, in case any of the above cited documents/details are not available in the Demat account(s), in terms of SEBI Circulars, the trading account(s) shall be dealt in manner as specified in SEBI Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/POD-1/P/CIR/2024/81 dated June 10, 2024. Members holding shares in electronic form may obtain Nomination forms from their respective DP.
20. Members holding shares in physical form, in identical order of names, in more than one folio are requested to send to the RTA/Company, the details of such folios together with the share certificates along with the requisite KYC documents for consolidating their holding in one folio. Request for consolidation of shares certificate shall be processed in dematerialised form only. Consolidated Shares will be issued to such member after making requisite changes.
21. To prevent fraudulent transactions, Members are advised to exercise due diligence and notify the Company of any change in address or demise of any Member as soon as possible. Members are also advised not to leave their demat account(s) dormant for long. Periodic statement of holdings should be obtained from the concerned DPs and holdings should be verified from time to time.
22. **The Instructions for members for remote e-Voting and Joining the AGM are as follows:**
 - I. The remote e-Voting period commences on Monday, September 22, 2025 (09:00 A.M.) (IST) and ends on Wednesday, September 24, 2025 (05:00 P.M.) (IST). During this period only the members of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, whose names appear in the Register of Members or Register of Beneficial Owners, as on the cut-off date of September 18, 2025, may cast their vote by remote e-Voting. The remote e-Voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the member, the member shall not be allowed to change it subsequently. The voting rights of members shall be proportionate to their share of the paid-up equity share capital of the company as on the cut-off date. E-voting rights cannot

be exercised by a proxy, though corporate and institutional shareholders shall be entitled to vote through their authorized representatives with proof of their authorization.

- II. Mr. Ashok Kumar Daga, Practicing Company Secretary (Membership No. FCS: 2699, C.P.No: 2948) has been appointed as the Scrutinizer to scrutinize the e-Voting during the AGM and remote e-Voting process in a fair and transparent manner.
- III. The way to vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system consists of “Two Steps” which are mentioned below:

Step 1: Log-in to NSDL e-Voting system at <https://www.evoting.nsdl.com/>

Step 2: Cast your vote electronically on NSDL e-Voting system.

Step 1: Access to NSDL e-Voting system:

A) Login method for e-Voting and joining virtual meeting for Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode

Dividend:

Due to paucity of funds of the Company, your Directors do not recommend any dividend for the Financial Year 2024-2025.

Operations and State of Company's Affairs:

During the year under review, total revenue of the Company was Rs 50.39 Lacs as compared to Rs 43.87 Lacs in the previous year. The Profit after tax was Rs 8.74 Lacs as against Loss after Tax of Rs 3.69 Lacs in the previous year.

Transfer to General Reserve:

The Company proposes not to transfer any funds to the General Reserve for the Financial Year 2024-2025.

Future Outlook:

The plastic compounding market is valued at USD 82.0 Billion in 2025 and is expected to reach USD 182.0 Billion by 2035, advancing at an 8.3% Compound Annual Growth Rate ("CAGR") throughout the forecast period. Within the plastic compounding market, the United States remains the most lucrative country in 2025 thanks to entrenched automotive and packaging clusters. Meanwhile, China is poised to be the fastest-growing national market from 2025 to 2035 as EV assembly plants; appliance production and infrastructure spending keep resin demand surging. Across industries, regulatory pushes for vehicle light-weighting, single-use-plastic curbs and net-zero commitments are reshaping the plastic compounding market. Feed-stock volatility and the steep capex of advanced recycling restrain smaller converters but automation and AI-driven inline quality controls are lifting yields and compressing scrap rates. Key trends steering the plastic compounding market include graphene-enhanced conductivity packs and regionalised

toll-compounding hubs that slash logistics emissions. Looking ahead, the plastic compounding market is set to pivot toward mass-customised, circular-ready polymers. By 2030, chemical-recycling inputs are forecast to cover 15% of global compound tonnage, while digital product passports will trace every pellet's carbon intensity. Compounding firms that embed closed-loop take-back, deploy green-hydrogen-fed extrusion lines and co-develop drop-in resins with 3D-printing bureaus will capture outsized share through 2035. India's wires and cables market has also expanded significantly from Rs 859 Billion in Financial Year 2019 to Rs 1,702 Billion in Financial Year 2024, registering a CAGR of 14.7% during this period. Furthermore, the sector is projected to grow at a CAGR of 11-13% between Financial Year 2024 and Financial Year 2029. The significant share of power transmission cables can be attributed to favourable government initiatives in the power sector, such as railway electrification projects and rural electrification schemes. Additionally, rising expenditures in the construction sector and the expansion of the Fast-Moving Electrical Goods industry are driving the demand for building wires.

Change in nature of Business, if any:

There has been no change in the nature of business of the Company during the year under review.

Transfer of Amount to Investor Education and Protection Fund:

Your Company has not declared any dividend in the preceding years hence the Company does not have any dividend lying unpaid or unclaimed for a period of seven years. As such there are no funds which are required to be transferred to Investor Education and Protection Fund ("IEPF").

Material changes and commitments affecting the financial position of the Company:

No material changes and commitments affecting the financial position of the Company have occurred between the end of the financial year to which the financial statement relate and the date of this report.

Particulars of Loans, Guarantees and Investments:

The Company has given loans exceeding sixty per cent of its paid-up share capital, free reserves and securities premium account or one hundred per cent of its free reserves and securities premium account, but the same are within the limits as approved by the members of Company, vide special resolution, in its Annual General Meeting ("AGM") held on September 22, 2017 and therefore in compliance with the provisions of Section 186 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"). Details of Loans, pursuant to the provisions of Section 186 of the Act are provided in the financial statement.

Particulars of Contracts or Arrangements made with Related Parties:

In line with the requirements of the Act and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements), Regulations, 2015 ("SEBI Listing Regulations"), your Company has formulated a policy on Related Party Transactions which is also available on the website of the Company at www.kkalpanaplastick.com.

All transactions with the related parties during the year under review were in the ordinary course of business and at arm's length. The disclosure required under Section 134(3)(h) of the Act read with Section 188(1) of the Act in Form AOC 2 forms part of this report and the same is marked as **Annexure 1**.

Deposits:

Your Company has not accepted any deposit during the year under review in terms of Section 73 of the Act, read with Companies (Acceptance of Deposit) Rules, 2014 and there were no unpaid deposits with the Company as at March 31, 2025.

Details of Subsidiary/Joint-Venture/Associate Companies:

Your Company does not have any Subsidiary/Associate Company and had neither entered into any Joint

Venture as at March 31, 2025. Further, none of the Company has become or ceased to become the Subsidiary, Joint Venture or Associate of your Company during the Financial Year 2024-2025.

Your Company is a Subsidiary Company of Bbigplas Poly Private Limited as at March 31, 2025.

Risk Management:

Compliance Risk:

With the frequent changes/modifications/amendments/enactments/re-enactments in various laws/regulations/guidelines/ rules, the Company has to face risk related to its compliance. The provision related to penalties, prosecutions, etc. are inherent to all businesses and the Company is no exception. However, the Company and its executive make sincere efforts to stay updated with applicable provisions of laws and various statutes.

Financial Risk:

Financial Risk is one of the major concerns of every business across fields and geographies. Market changes or losses can threaten a company's financial standing. Here are few types of financial risks for businesses:

- **Default risk:** Taking out a business loan with greater interest than a company can afford can put a company at risk of defaulting or not paying the loan.

The actual scope of environmental risks is broad. As identified by the World Economic Forum, climate action failure tops this list, followed by extreme weather events and in third place, biodiversity loss.

Human Resource Risk:

Human Resource Risk ("HR Risk") management focuses on analyzing the risks that employees of an organization pose to the business. HR Risk management addresses risks related to inadequate employee management, employees' behavior or risks related to certain ways that human resources use to hire and sack employees.

The primary focus of the HR Risk management is to closely follow the work of all employees at all levels, in order to identify, evaluate, mitigate and prevent risks in a timely manner. Risks coming from employees are the most difficult to manage and many large scale organizations struggle to plan or prepare for them.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT**World Economic Overview:**

Plastic has become an integral part of our daily lives, from the packaging of products we consume to the materials used in construction, automobiles and electronics. The global plastic manufacturing industry has witnessed a significant growth in recent years, driven by factors such as the increasing demand for plastic products, technological advancements in plastic manufacturing and the adoption of sustainable practices. To address environmental concerns related to plastic waste, the industry is exploring sustainable practices such as recycling, the use of bioplastics made from renewable resources and the adoption of circular economy models. Digitalization and Industry technologies are also expected to play a significant role in improving efficiency and reducing costs in the industry. Future Outlook:

The plastic compounding market is valued at USD 82.0 Billion in 2025 and is expected to reach USD 182.0 Billion by 2035, advancing at an 8.3% Compound Annual Growth Rate (“CAGR”) throughout the forecast period. Within the plastic compounding market, the United States remains the most lucrative country in 2025 thanks to entrenched automotive and packaging clusters. Meanwhile, China is poised to be the fastest-growing national market from 2025 to 2035 as EV assembly plants; appliance production and infrastructure spending keep resin demand surging. Across industries, regulatory pushes for vehicle light-weighting, single-use-plastic curbs and net-zero commitments are reshaping the plastic compounding market. Feed-stock volatility and the steep capex of advanced recycling restrain smaller converters but automation and AI-driven inline quality controls are lifting yields and compressing scrap rates. Key trends steering the plastic compounding market include graphene-enhanced conductivity packs and regionalised toll-compounding hubs that slash logistics emissions. Looking ahead, the plastic compounding market is set to pivot toward mass-customised, circular-ready polymers. By 2030, chemical-recycling inputs are forecast to cover 15% of global compound tonnage, while digital product passports will trace every pellet’s carbon intensity. Compounding firms that embed closed-loop take-back, deploy green-hydrogen-fed extrusion lines and co-develop drop-in resins with 3D-printing bureaus will capture outsized share through 2035. India’s wires and cables market has also expanded significantly from Rs 859 Billion in Financial Year 2019 to Rs 1,702 Billion in Financial Year 2024, registering a CAGR of 14.7% during this period. Furthermore, the sector is projected to grow at a CAGR of 11-13% between Financial Year 2024 and Financial Year 2029. The significant share of power transmission cables can be attributed to favourable government initiatives in the power sector, such as railway electrification projects and rural electrification schemes. Additionally, rising expenditures in the construction sector and the expansion of the Fast-Moving Electrical Goods industry are driving the demand for building wires.

Challenges in the Plastic Industry:

The plastic industry faces several challenges that require attention and strategic planning to ensure sustainable growth and mitigate potential risks. Two significant challenges include environmental impact and pollution as well as health and safety concerns.

- **Environmental Impact and Pollution:** The production and use of plastics have a significant impact on the environment. The plastic industry heavily relies on fossil fuels and the continued growth of

the industry is projected to increase plastic production by 40% over the next decade, as reported by the Center for Biological Diversity. This increase in plastic production can lead to environmental pollution, particularly in neighborhoods and waterways.

- **Health and Safety Concerns:** The plastic industry also faces health and safety concerns, both for workers in the industry and the communities surrounding plastic production facilities. The emissions from plastic production facilities, as mentioned earlier, can contribute to various health issues such as asthma, lung cancer and cardiovascular diseases in neighboring communities as reported by Center for Biological Diversity.

Opportunity and Threats:

Opportunity:

- The use of plastic made products has gained considerable response from the customers. In number of items of Retail and Industrial consumption, it is found that the use of plastic made products has replaced many other products as the best substitute products. The increase in the use of plastic products will open new areas for the plastic Industries.
- Polymers are the foundation of plastic and are used in a wide variety of applications, including packaging, automotive, construction, electronics, medical etc.
- Plastics exhibit a number of useful characteristics ideal for wire insulation, including ductility, electrical resistance, UV resistance and fire resistance and therefore find use in cable and wire industry.
- Plastics used in Automotive Industries are required to be lightweight, so as to reduce fuel consumption.
- The use of 3D printing technology in plastic manufacturing is on the rise, allowing manufacturers to produce complex plastic parts with greater precision and customization. This technology is expected to revolutionize the manufacturing industry and create new opportunities for plastic manufacturers.
- The circular economy is an emerging concept that aims to minimize waste and promote sustainability by reusing and recycling materials. Plastic manufacturers are increasingly adopting this concept, with many companies investing in recycling facilities and producing more sustainable plastic products.
- Government of India has launched many initiatives like Make in India, Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan for making the country and its citizens independent and self-reliant in all senses. This will have a positive effect on the growth of many industries.

Threat:

- One of the major factors that are expected to restrain the growth of the plastic compounding market is the fluctuating raw material prices. Therefore, this is expected to hinder the growth of the plastics compounding market.
- There has been the imposition of various stringent regulations on the use of plastic with rising environmental concerns related to the toxicity issues and this will pose a major challenge to the growth of the global plastic compounding market.
- Possible restraints for the plastic compounding market include increasing concerns about environment pollution and the need for sustainable solutions. Stringent regulations on single-use plastics, recycling challenges and a shift towards biodegradable alternatives may limit the growth of traditional plastic compounds.
- The fluctuating raw material prices and supply chain disruptions could impact the industry's profitability. The rise of alternative materials like bio-based polymers and the growing preference for recycled plastics might pose a competitive challenge. Furthermore, global economic uncertainties

and geopolitical factors could influence investment decisions and hinder market expansion for plastic compounding.

Risks and Concerns:

At Kkalpana Plastick Limited, management ensures that risks are adequately measured, estimated and mitigated. Based on operations of the Company, new risks, if any, are identified and steps are taken to mitigate the same.

- **Risk identification** is a set of activities that detect, describe and catalog all potential risks to assets and processes that could negatively impact business outcomes in terms of performance, quality, damage, loss or reputation. It acts as input for actual risk analysis of the relevant risks to an organization.
- **Risk Mitigation** is the process of planning for disasters and having a way to lessen negative impacts. It mainly focuses on the inevitability of some disasters and is used for those situations where a threat cannot be avoided entirely.
- **Follow Up:** In case of risk which the company has identified, regular follow-up is required. There is a procedural check in order to ensure that the risk, whose mitigation plan is there, does not reoccur. However, if it reoccurs, there should be a suitable mitigation plan ready for it.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a. Basis of Preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with IND AS and Disclosures thereon comply with requirements of IND AS, stipulations contained in Schedule- III (revised) as applicable under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014, Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015 as amended from time to time, other pronouncement of ICAI, provisions of the Companies Act and Rules and guidelines issued by SEBI as applicable. Assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in revised Schedule – III to the Companies Act, 2013.

b. Use of Estimates

IND AS enjoins management to make estimates and assumptions related to financial statements, that affect reported amount of assets, liabilities, revenue, expenses and contingent liabilities pertaining to the year. Actual result may differ from such estimates. Any revision in accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the period of change and material revision, including its impact on financial statements, is reported in the notes to accounts in the year of incorporation of revision.

c. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sales are recognised when the substantial risks and rewards of ownership in the goods are transferred to the buyer as per the terms of the contract and are recognised net of trade discounts/allowance, sales return and sales taxes/value added tax.

d. Inventories

Inventories are valued at Cost or Net Realisable Value whichever is lower. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs necessary to make the sale. Provision is made for obsolete/slow moving/defective stocks, wherever necessary. Provision is made for obsolete/slow moving/defective stocks, wherever necessary.

e. Investments

Investments that are readily realisable and are intended to be held for not more than one year from the date, on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified under Non-Current Assts as long-term investments. Current investments are carried at cost or fair value, whichever is lower. Long term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution is made to recognise a decline, other than temporary, in the value of the investments, such reduction being determined and made for each investment individually.

f. Fixed Assets & Depreciation

i. Tangible Fixed Assets are stated at acquisition cost, net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. The cost comprises of purchase cost, borrowing costs if capitalisation criteria are met and other directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to its working conditions for intended use. The cost also comprises of exchange differences arising on translation settlement of long-term foreign currency monetary items pertaining to acquisition of

such depreciable assets. Any trade discounts and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price.

- ii. The Depreciation is provided on Straight Line Method in accordance with Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

g. Taxation

Tax expense comprises current and deferred tax.

Current Income Tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred Tax reflect the impact of timing differences between taxable income and accounting income originating during the current year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years. As at the balance sheet date, unless there is evidence to the contrary, deferred tax assets pertaining to business losses are only recognised to the extent that there are deferred tax liabilities offsetting them.

Minimum Alternative Tax credit is recognised as an asset only when and to the extent there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period. Such asset is reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and the carrying amount of the MAT credit asset is written down to the extent there is no longer convincing evidence to the effect that the Company will pay normal income tax during the year.

h. Employee Benefits

Short term Employee Benefits (i.e. benefits payable within one year) are recognised in the period in which employee services are rendered.

Contribution towards provident fund for certain employees is made to the regulatory authorities, where the Company has no further obligations. Such benefits are classified as defined contribution schemes as the Company does not carry any further obligations, apart from the contributions made on a monthly basis.

The Company provides gratuity, a defined benefit plan (the 'Gratuity Plan') covering eligible employees in accordance with the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972. The Gratuity Plan provides a yearly contribution to Group Gratuity Scheme to vested employees at retirement, death, incapacitation or termination of employment, of an amount based on respective employee's salary and the tenure of employment.

Contributions to the Central Government administered Employees' State Insurance Scheme for eligible employees is recognised as a charge in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the year in which they arise

i. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, demand deposits with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

j. Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Earnings considered in ascertaining the Company's earnings per share is the net profit/(loss) for the period after deducting preference dividends if any and any attributable tax thereto for the period. The weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period and for all periods presented is adjusted for events, such as bonus shares, other than the conversion of potential equity shares that have changed the number of equity shares outstanding, without a corresponding change

in resources.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit/(loss) for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period is adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

k. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities & Contingent Assets:

Provisions: Provisions are recognised when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and there is a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the Balance Sheet date and are not discounted to its present value.

Contingent Liabilities: Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or nonoccurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made, is termed as a contingent liability.

Contingent Assets: Contingent Assets are neither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements since this may result in recognition of income that may never be realised.

l. Segment reporting

The company's operating businesses being only one segment is organised and managed according to the nature of products. Accordingly, the business constitutes the Primary Segment for disclosure of segment information. The Company operates predominantly within the geographical limits of India. and accordingly, secondary segments have not been considered. The Company prepares its segment information in conformity with the accounting policies adopted for preparing and presenting the Financial Statements of the Company as a whole.

m. Impairment of Assets

Impairment loss is recognised wherever the carrying amount of an asset at the Balance Sheet date based on external and internal sources of information is in excess of recoverable amount and the same is recognized as an expense in the statement of profit and loss and carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. Reversal of impairment losses recognized in prior years is recorded when there is an indication that the impairment losses recognised for the assets no longer exist or have decreased.
